Want to see polar bears in Siberia or penguins at the South Pole? Head off on a glacial expedition, says James Ellis

Basecamp Spitsbergen, Norway

Head to Longyearbyen for a five-night stay in rugged Basecamp Spitsbergen. Built using driftwood, sealskin and slate, the glass ceiling allows perfect views of the northern lights. The former mining town has a frontier feel and, given the snowy landscape, transport is by snowmobile, dog sleds or skis. Use them to explore glaciers, fjords and floating packs of ice, or take a kayaking expedition around the coast, home to grazing reindeer and colonies of birds. For an extra adventure, spend a night on the Ship in the Ice in Tempelfjord, the only hotel boat frozen in sea ice in the world. Details From £1,990pp for five nights' B&B. Wolves in Prince Albert National Park, Canada

While Saskatchewan's Prince Albert
National Park is on the same longitude as
London, its remote nature sees it turn
into a winter wonderland. On this
six-night trip to the vast boreal forest—
the largest in Canada—you search for
grey wolf, moose and great grey owls.
Guides take you on daily excursions by
snowshoe, dog sled or 4x4 in search of the
elusive wildlife, following their tracks and
telltale signs in an attempt to spot them.

Scott's Antarctica

This month is the 100th anniversary of the race to reach the South Pole between Captain Robert Scott and the Norwegian explorer Roald Amundsen, and this cruise follows in Scott's sledgemarks. The 20-night cruise takes in remote parts of Antarctica, including Enderby Island, Macquarie Island and the Ross Sea region. The voyage to the Ross Sea will attempt to edge south to Cape Evans, where Scott's 1911 Terra Nova hut is located. The largest historic building on the continent, it was used in the
